Project: Hickory Haven/Samary Forest Sewer Installation

RE: Project Update and Private Property Access

Dear Property Owner,

On November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018, the Goochland County Board of Supervisors authorized the approval of a professional engineering contract for design of the Hickory Haven and Samary Forest public sewer project. This contract was subsequently awarded to Timmons Group, Inc. and we are pleased to inform you that the preliminary engineering phase of this project is almost complete.

The next step in the design process is to complete the Field Services portion, which includes locating of existing underground utilities, surveying, wetlands delineation, and a geotechnical investigation. This work is set to commence during the last week of March 2019 and is expected to last until the end of July 2019, weather permitting.

Furthermore, a representative of Timmons Group will contact the owner(s) of any property that will need to be accessed with mechanized equipment prior to needing access to ensure that any concerns of those affected property owners are heard and understood.

Once Field Services are complete and engineering design is underway, DPU will schedule an additional community meeting to provide project updates and gather further design input from residents.
